Admired as much for his artistic ability as for his architectural skill, Rossi has exhibited at galleries around the world.

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This beautifully illustrated book provides a crucial new look at Aldo Rossi's built work in relationship to his writings, drawings, and product design, and explores his contributions to the architecture in postwar Italy.

All twenty-two original articles in the current volume are based on lectures given at the conference “ The Jews in Italy: Their Contribution to the Development and Diffusion of Jewish Heritage ” , which was convened in September 2011, at the University of Bologna, Department of Cultural Heritage. Geographically, the articles range from Italy to the Ottoman Empire (the Balkans and Aleppo), from France and Germany to the Middle East, including Israel, North and East Africa (Morocco, Tunisia, Libya, and Ethiopia). Chronologically, articles begin with the Roman period, through the Middle Ages and Renaissance until modern times. In this collection, the reader will find a wide range of subjects reflecting various scholarly perspectives such as history; Christian-Jewish relations; Kabbalah; commentary on the Bible and Talmud; language, grammar, and translation; literature; philosophy; gastronomy; art; culture; folklore; and education.

Who gets commemorated in art and why? And how do we react to statues of politicians we deplore? In this book—against a background of today ’ s “ sculpture wars ” —Mary Beard tells the story of how for more than two millennia portraits of the rich, powerful, and famous in the western world have been shaped by the image of Roman emperors, especially the “ Twelve Caesars, ” from the ruthless Julius Caesar to the fly-torturing Domitian. Twelve Caesars asks why these murderous autocrats have loomed so large in art from antiquity and the Renaissance to today, when hapless leaders are still caricatured as Neros fiddling while Rome burns. Beginning with the importance of imperial portraits in Roman politics, this richly illustrated book offers a tour through 2,000 years of art and cultural history, presenting a fresh look at works by artists from Memling and Mantegna to the nineteenth-century American sculptor Edmonia Lewis, as well as by generations of weavers, cabinetmakers, silversmiths, printers, and ceramicists. Rather than a story of a simple repetition of stable, blandly conservative images of imperial men and women, Twelve Caesars is an unexpected tale of changing identities, clueless or deliberate misidentifications, fakes, and often ambivalent representations of authority. From Beard ’ s reconstruction of Titian ’ s extraordinary lost Room of the Emperors to her reinterpretation of Henry VIII ’ s famous Caesarian tapestries, Twelve Caesars includes fascinating detective work and offers a gripping story of some of the most challenging and disturbing portraits of power ever created. The International Building Exhibition 1984/87 in Berlin constitutes one of the most remarkable examples to discuss "open architecture". Almost 10,000 dwellings were constructed or restored in the Kreuzberg districts adjacent to the Berlin Wall, inhabited about halfway by immigrants. The renowned author Esra Akcan, related in many ways to Turkey, Berlin and the USA, narrates the history and reverberations of this architectural-political event.

Il 4 settembre del 1997 Aldo Rossi perdeva la vita in un incidente d ’ auto nella sua Milano dov ’ era nato sessantasei anni prima. Con la sua scomparsa lasciava in eredit à i frutti del suo lavoro di architetto e di studioso, costituito da numerosi scritti, disegni, e progetti. Un lavoro, il suo, caratterizzato tra

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l'altro da un rigoroso metodo analitico e analogico che lo portava a un continuo e ostinato ritorno sugli stessi temi per riempirli ogni volta di nuovi significati. La scrittura, come l'architettura, è per definizione indifferente al significato della parola scritta, ed è appunto questo il senso della ricerca sulla tipologia che porterà Aldo Rossi all'elaborazione di una teoria nella quale si individua proprio nel tipo architettonico il fattore predominante per la persistenza e adattabilità delle costruzioni al modificarsi degli usi. Inoltre, proponendo una teoria della città come locus della memoria collettiva, senza dubbio è stato in grado di apportare un prezioso e fondamentale contributo alla comprensione della stessa e alla ridefinizione della "scienza urbana". Tra tutti i suoi progetti, alcuni riguardano Trieste e dei tre elaborati per la Città, sono proprio i due non realizzati quelli di cui ci occupiamo in questo breve scritto.

A collection of essays from 26 issues of "Oppositions", this text presents contributions from architects, theorists and historians such as Aldo Rossi, Alan Colquhoun, Leon Krier and Denise Scott Brown, amongst others, are included.

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
