The present work is focused on the mathematical and computational theory behind a technique for deformable image registration termed Hyperelastic Warping, and demonstration of the technique via applications in image registration and strain measurement. The approach combines well-established principles of nonlinear continuum mechanics with forces derived directly from three-dimensional image data to achieve registration. The general approach does not require the definition of landmarks, fiducials, or surfaces, although it can accommodate these if available.
