Brite and Kiernan team up to present two original novels and a collaborative story. The crystal empire: Zee's cruel lover Matthew tests her devotion by asking her to help murder a singer with whom he is obsessed. Onion: Frank and Willa seem to have nothing in common except the group meetings they attend together: OWA, Other Worlds Anonymous, for people who have stumbled into wrong places. Brite has done it again with a provocative new collection even more dangerously seductive, more boldly erotic than her first. It is not for everyone. But it may be what you need.
