When the camera tilts, it pivots up and down. Tilting is commonly used to look over tall objects such as a cathedral or an office building. To conceptualize a Tilt, stare straight ahead and pivot your head to look up and down. Like the Pan, this technique is used within a scene to follow characters in motion — known as re-framing the shot.

The target-side hip and shoulder should be slightly higher than the back hip and shoulder. The entire pelvis should be set an inch or two toward the target.
