He refutes lingering misconceptions about Reconstruction, including the attribution of its ills to corrupt African American politicians and “ carpetbaggers, ” and connects it to the movements for civil rights and racial justice. Joshua Brown ’ s illustrated commentary on the era ’ s graphic art and photographs complements the narrative. He offers a unique portrait of how Americans envisioned their world and time.
